



## **Directions**

There are two campuses for the University of Hertfordshire – College Lane and de-Havilland. These are instruction to the de-Havilland campus. You need to ensure you enter the University at the accommodation entrance rather than the main entrance (Postcode, AL10 9EU). See details below.

## **Public transport links to Hatfield**

**Hatfield station** (two kilometres from the campus) is served by First Capital Connect trains from London Kings Cross (usual journey time 22 minutes), as well as local services from Cambridge and Peterborough.

Direct local trains run between Hatfield and Stevenage (journey time 15 minutes) connecting with Intercity services to the North.

There is a taxi rank and bus stop at the station for connections to the campuses (Buses 603, 341 and 641). A shuttle bus service operates regularly throughout the day between the College Lane and de Havilland campuses.


Alternatively, St Albans is a sixteen-minute bus journey from the University (Bus 602 or 655).


## **Travelling by Car**

From all directions on the M25, leave at junction 23. At the roundabout take the A1M (North), signposted towards Hatfield. Leave the A1M at junction 3.

From Junction 3 of the A1M, at the roundabout take the second exit onto Comet way/A1001 and continue to the traffic lights. Take the first exit onto St Albans Road West (You will be driving past the Ramada Jarvis Hotel). At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Mosquito Way (You will be able to see the University on your left!). Take the first exit at the roundabout into the University Campus.

Once you are at the University, Follow the road around and you will come to a security hut, just tell then you are here for the Dance for Parkinson's sessions. Drive all the way down the Car Park and Park as close as you can to the sports center. Then enter 'Club De Havilland' on the left side of the building. There will be a member of the team in the Car Park to point you in the right direction!
