This Time Tue 9 Jun 19:30

With a cast ranging in age from 13 to 60, *This Time* by Ockham's Razor combines circus, autobiographical storytelling and awe-inspiring aerial performance to create compelling visual theatre. It explores themes of love, support and struggle in families, alongside perceptions of strength and ability: how we are strong in different ways at different times in our lives.

Featuring a series of aerial frames which are raised from floor to ceiling, the four performers lift, push and cradle each other through thresholds and over ledges. Bodies are suspended high in the air and swung close to the ground in innovative new takes on trapeze and swinging cradle performance.

We also look after the UH Art Collection which comprises around 500 artworks displayed around our campuses.

We encounter plastic in our everyday actions; we buy it, use it, throw it away, and we touch it as we use our phones, travel in our cars, open pre-packaged food. Plastic is synonymous with modern life – essential to productivity and key to convenience. Yet plastic consumption and pollution are increasingly controversial subjects and key issues of our time. a mix of tales about plastic – plastic as inspiration, plastic as material, plastic as resource and plastic as waste.

Eight artists explore plastic's potential to become something more treasured, its availability and its hasty disposal. They imbue new worth and meaning to the material and ask us to consider its role and potential in contemporary society going forward.

Classical Music

The de Havilland Philharmonic Orchestra is the resident orchestra of the University of Hertfordshire. Founded in 1969, when the University was Hatfield Polytechnic, this year the orchestra celebrate their Golden Anniversary – their 50th concert season. Conducted by Robin Browning, the orchestra is a full symphony orchestra made up of semi-professional and talented amateur musicians. They perform regularly in the Weston Auditorium and their concerts often feature renowned soloists.

de Havilland Philharmonic: Elgar and Tchaikovsky Sun 22 Mar 15:30

The concert opens with Elgar's *Cockaigne Overture* which gives a lively musical portrait of Edwardian London.

Elgar's ever-popular *Cello Concerto*, which first premiered in 1919, is performed by soloist Bozidar Vukotic. Bozidar is the founder member of the Tippett String Quartet and a guest principal cello with many of the country's best orchestras. Tchaikovsky's 5th Symphony, a work that was initially seen as a failure, is now one of his most popular works and closes the concert.
